Arizona Temperatures will stay near seasonal norms through Saturday, with highs in the upper 80s to mid 90s and lows in the mid 50s to low 60s. A cold front will arrive Saturday night, dropping Sunday's highs to the mid 60s to mid 70s. Winds will strengthen Saturday afternoon, gusting up to 25 mph, shifting to 3040 mph on Sunday.**California** High pressure continues to bring near or above-average temps, with lows in the upper 30s to low 50s and highs from the low 60s near the coast to mid 80s inland. A lowpressure system arrives Friday night, bringing weekend showers with most fields seeing under ¼ inch of rain. **Florida** Warm, mostly dry weather is expected through Friday. A cold front over the weekend may bring showers and thunderstorms. Highs will range from the low 80s to low 90s, with lows in the low 60s to low 70s. Winds will gust up to 25 mph, especially in southeast Florida and the Tampa Bay area, through May 2nd. **Mexico** Warm weather continues through the weekend with isolated showers, mostly under 0.10", though some storms may bring more. Highs range from mid 80s to mid 90s, except near Mexico City, where they'll be in the upper 70s to mid 80s. Lows will stay in the low 50s to low 60s.

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
